- THI Staff quoted in Columbia Journalism Review article on Ebola Dr. Dennis Andrulis, Senior Research Scientist, was featured in the Columbus Journalism Review on October 22, 2014, sharing his sentiments on the heightening accounts of xenophobia following the emergence of Ebola in the United States. He described emerging xenophobic narratives, and the events on the ground that mirrored them, as "threat-based responses." He added: "The 'other' is seen as a threat to me, so I'm going to look at ways to take that threat off the table, either by disallowing people visiting, or staying away from people of other cultures, or casting suspicion upon the motivation or willingness of certain folks to participate." Also featured in the article is a toolkit that THI staff developed and issued on emergency preparedness for culturally diverse communities in 2011.

THI is connecting several building blocks funded by two recently awarded grants to create our eLearning, or online education structure.
